

Step-by-Step Guide

Step	Description
Choose a Journey	Let the troop help pick which theme excites them most. Having a choice keeps them motivated.
Plan Meetings	Break the Journey into smaller meetings. Each step includes activities, reflections, and teamwork.
Do the Activities	Games, crafts, skits, and roleplays keep learning fun and hands-on.
Work on the Take Action Project	This is the highlight of every Brownie Journey. Encourage the girls to come up with the project idea themselves.
Celebrate and Reflect	End the Journey with a troop celebration and reflection circle. This helps the girls feel proud of what they've accomplished.

The Three Journeys


Brownie Quest Journey

The Brownie Quest Journey focuses on discovering yourself, your family, and your troop. Girls learn about values, leadership, and teamwork while completing their first Take Action project.



WOW Wonders of Water

This Journey helps Brownies understand the importance of water in the world. They explore conservation, clean water, and how water connects to communities. Many troops choose a Take Action project like raising awareness or protecting a local creek.




It's Your World, Change It
